



Commitment: 10 Commandments

We, the Members of Government, Directors General and National Directors of the State Institutions, together with the representatives of the private sector, gathered on the 4-6 of August 2014 in the Dili Convention Center in order to discuss about “Identifying problems and Finding Solutions” in order to improve the performance of the State.

Following the presentations and discussions, we have identified some problems and solutions and we commit to improve and solve the issues identified through the measures listed below:

1. Everyone commits to implement one Vision, one Plan, one Action, aligned with the SDP matrix and to commit to the KPIs (Key Performance Indicators) as a performance measure;
2. Everyone commits to find out and obtain the necessary information about the existing finance system before publicly stating the information;
3. Everyone commits to create mechanisms (such as, *inter alia*. A Consultative Council Meeting, write minutes and *follow-up* on issues) in order to improve internal communication and coordination;
4. Everyone commits to improve and strengthen the interministerial, interagency and intersectoral coordination, in order to ensure the processes relating to planning and budgeting;
5. All the DG commit to attend the regular meetings on budget execution;
6. The National Private Sector commits to find out and disseminate the correct information to all its members (including Laws, regulations etc...) as well as focus on improving the capacity of all its members.
7. The National Private Sector commits to work together with the Government in order to ensure the quality of projects;
8. The Government commits to create a Legal unit in the presidency of the Council of Ministers with the aim of analyzing Laws such that they are not duplicated, contradictory and are geared towards the development of Timor-Leste;
9. The Government commits to create a unit in the Prime Minister's Office responsible for ensuring budget monitoring and supervision;
10. All commit to change from a “deixa andar” (*laissez-faire*) to a “faço hoje” (do it today) attitude.
